Winter Freeze Checklist



Temperatures that fall below 20 degrees, particularly when accompanied by strong winter winds, dramatically increase the possibility of frozen water pipes and damage from bursting and flooding. It's important that you plan ahead. Inconvenience and financial loss can be reduced if you follow these simple guidelines:

- * Keep your house heated to at least 55 degrees.
- * Disconnect hoses from outside faucets.
- * Drip lukewarm water from at least one inside faucet so that both hot and cold pipes are involved.
- * Ask a neighbor to check pipes if you are going to be away for any length of time.
- * Turn off all outside water and drain lines. Should a faucet freeze, you can thaw an inside faucet easily with a good hair dryer. Outside faucets, however, usually require both the hair dryer and plenty of hot water.
- * If a pipe burst, take the following steps:
 1. Shut water off at the main valve. If the break is in a hot water pipe, the valve on top of the hot water heater should be closed.
 2. Call a plumber.

A pipe doesn't necessarily burst the first time it freezes. Sometimes it takes several freezes and thaws before the damage occurs. Hopefully these tips will help make the winter months more pleasant and worry-free!

One (1) birdhouse or birdfeeder is permitted per unit but must be located in the back of the unit and at least three (3) feet beyond the routinely mowed and maintained Common Area. Bird houses and birdfeeders are **NOT** to be installed on decks, patios, or in mulch beds. However, one (1) hummingbird feeder is permitted on the deck or patio in the rear of the unit.

2 # Ground Chuck
2 15oz. cans diced tomatoes
2 8oz cans Tomato Sauce
1 Med. onion, diced
2 cans bushes hot chili beans
1 tblsp chili powder
1 tblsp oregano
1 tsp cumin
1 tblsp salt
1 tblsp garlic powder



Brown meat and onions, add remaining ingredients except beans. Bring to a boil and simmer two hours. Add beans and simmer another hour.. Better the next day.
